Hand sanitizer will be available before and after 'touch points' such as doors and coffee machines. This will include entering and exiting the main Ticket Office at Peasholm. Contactless payments are encouraged where possible, with handling of cash kept to a minimum. Tickets are to be collected by the person making the purchase, and not handled by any members of staff.
